Bringing them off the streets

Our First Contact work includes:

- working on the streets where the teenagers are
- First Aid attention on the streets
- visits to the prison and hospitals when in need
- El Toborochi, Reception Home,

all aimed at encouraging the teenagers to leave their life on the streets, where they survive through stealing, solvent/drug abuse and/or prostitution, and into our restoration homes, where they can receive the love, acceptance and care that they need to be able to develop and grow socially, psychologically and spiritually in preparation for their reintegration into their family and the society that has rejected them.



El Toborochi

Reception Home for Teenage Street Children

El Toborochi is a short term Reception Home where the teenagers spend 8 to 10 days when they initially come off the streets, before going into one of our Restoration Homes. This is a time of orientation and investigation into their family history, social and psychological profile as well as medical check-ups. This home also includes a dental surgery to attend the needs of both the youngsters on the streets and in our homes.



El Camino (The Way)

Restoration Home for Teenage Street Boys

El Camino opened its doors to receive teenage street boys in February 2002, and now has a capacity to receive up to 50 boys.

The home has a full programme of academic education, vocational training, Bible teaching and agricultural training as well as offering the boys a stable family environment.

The boys are placed in local schools and also have the support of our own teachers in the home.

We also have the regular support of a social worker, psychologist and medical professionals in addition to the everyday support of the live-in house-parents and staff. The two hectares of land where the home is located also produces significant quantities of vegetables and fruit as well as being home for chickens and ducks.



El Alfarero (The Potter)

Restoration Home for Teenage Street Girls with or without their children

El Alfarero opened its doors in May 2004 and has the capacity to receive up to 12 girls with or without their children or babies.

The home also has the full programme offered to the boys at El Camino, but also includes special orientation and training for the single mothers.

Many times the years on the streets are like a magnet that pulls them back into their old lives. On more than one occasion this causes them to leave the home for a time, until they return and continue with the restoration process, emotionally, physically, psychologically and spiritually.



Reintegration

Fulfilling the task

The aim is, that from both Restoration Homes the teenagers will move on to Christian homes once the restoration phase is complete. There, they can be supported and followed up as they reintegrate into the society and contribute to the society that once rejected them.

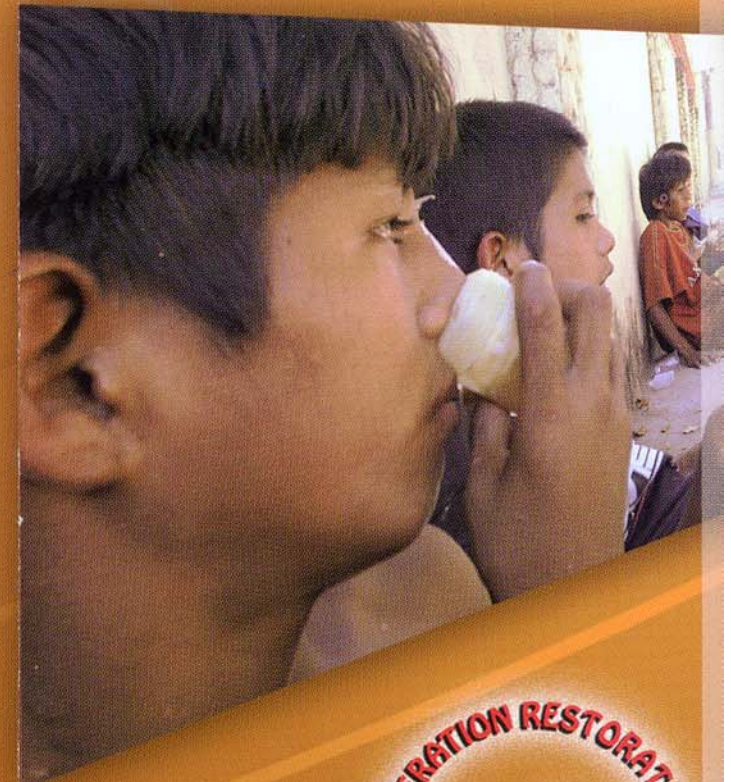
